Welcome to the Chatham and Clarendon Grammar School History department. We are extremely fortunate that we teach a subject which is engaging, relevant, diverse and popular. In the History department we give students the opportunity to explore a wide chronology, from the Norman Conquest to the Twentieth Century. Furthermore, the department's lessons, activities and assessments will ensure that all students are challenged and encouraged to develop their intellectual capabilities, in keeping with the real demands of the study of academic History.

What is our Aim? The aim of this school is to provide high quality education that is 'fit for purpose' for the twenty-first century. The History department follows a programme of teaching and learning designed to complement this ethos. The department believes that the academic study of History should comprise a balance between the development of understanding chronology (incorporating important events and individuals) and the development of analytical thinking skills. Through an organized programme, based around 'thematic' studies, we encourage students to develop important learning skills such as: evidence handling, organization and communication, and ordering and reasoning.

Will you get Homework? Yes! You could be set one piece of homework a week which will be checked by your teacher and will form an important part of your termly assessment grade.

How will you know how you're doing? Your teacher will use a variety of methods to decide how you are progressing. Your class work and homework will be assessed and a mark awarded along with any comments as to how you can improve your work for next time. You will also complete a major written piece of work (an essay) for each investigation; this will also help us to monitor how you are doing and will allow us to inform you of any areas for improvement. We are really interested in acknowledging you when you simply 'do' the right thing: being prepared, focused, resilient and committed to doing your best.
